

December 10, 2025

The general meeting of the Jewett Town Board was held on Wednesday December 10, 2025.

Supervisor Kroyer called the meeting to order at 7pm.

Present were Board Members James Pellitteri, John Giordano, Jeanie Scotti and John Pumilia.

Public present was Tony Geslak, Al Oliveri, Robin Fleishman, Jim Franz, Anatoly Tokarev and Marc Czermerys. Also present was the town clerk and the Town Attorney, Tal Rappleyea.

The Supervisors financial report for November was given to the Board prior to the meeting and the bank statements were reviewed by Board Members after the signing of the bills.

Review of Minutes

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Ok, ah, minutes of November 12, 2025, Councilman Pellitteri?"

Councilman Pellitteri said, "Ah, yeah, I make a motion to ah, not, ah not accept the minutes for the same reason as last month, that ah, what we were doing for 15 years that I've been on the board works really well and it's easier for people to understand and is actually giving more information than anything that can be typed ah, because I have the recordings".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Ok, does anyone wanna, oh you made the motion, so do I have a second?"

Councilman Pellitteri said, "I made the motion".

Councilwoman Scotti said, "I second that motion".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "All in favor?"

Council Members Pellitteri, Giordano and Scotti said AYE.

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Any opposed?"

Councilman Pumilia said, "AYE".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Ok, 4-1, the minutes are not accepted, let the record reflect that. Hey Mark".

Councilwoman Scotti said, "Hey Mark".

Human Services Contract for 2026

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Um, alright everybody in their folders has the building contract. I consider this to be good news. Um, looks like Human Services has decided they want to lease our building for another year at least, um I'm pretty sure this is based on the recent goings on with the public hearing, ah where the ah, public has weighed in heavily stating that ah, meals on wheels is an essential program and ah they want to keep it, so".

Councilman Giordano said, "Great".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Good for everybody ah, its, its it is exactly the same as last year, you know except for the dates um, so. I mean other than the, the ah UV filter that's the one that's gonna hurt us is, is cause we're forever having to repair that thing and I'm pretty sure we're gonna have to move it and put in the building here, ah maybe even fairly soon seems like. Cause there's some issues lately with it um, but you know other than that they pay us ah, \$1,500 per month which includes ah the cost of garbage and internet obviously electricity, heat all that. So, it's kind of routine, same contract that ah, was presented to us last year, ah my suggestion is let's just, lets, allow me to sign it ah, and let's get another year down the road, see what happens, if we have to look at any other issues with it, we will. Ah, but, I don't see a reason to ah, do anything but sign it".

Councilman Pumilia said, "Hey Greg, it sounds good but just for clarification for me, \$1,500 a month rent which includes cost of garbage and internet? I'm not sure if I'm reading that right? Includes meaning, we're paying for it or they're paying for it?"

Councilman Pellitteri said, "We're paying for it".
Supervisor Kroyer said, "We're paying for it, it's included".
Councilman Pumilia said, "We're paying for it".
Councilman Giordano said, "It just said, the gas, the heat, Greg just said that".
Councilman Pumilia said, "Ok".
Supervisor Kroyer said, "We pay for almost everything".
Councilman Pumilia said, "Alright no that's fine, I just wanted to make sure I understood it".
Supervisor Kroyer said, "They pay for what they own".
An AI voice said, "Recording in progress".
Supervisor Kroyer said, "They pay for what they own, ah".
Councilman Giordano said, "Cost of heat, water, lights, electricity, propane".
Councilwoman Scotti said, "Right, electricity, propane".
Supervisor Kroyer said, "Right, it's all in there. It's the same, there's nothing, you know we reviewed this closely ah because the County has a way of just slipping something in there on you".
Councilman Pellitteri said, "Yup".
Supervisor Kroyer said, "But, they didn't so ah, it's the same as prior years other than the ah, the dates, right the amounts even the same as last year, we negotiated an increase ah, a couple years ah, I forget if it was last year or the year before. I think we can hold fast on it, that's my suggestion at least. Ah, anybody wanna have any further discussion on this? Ok, in that case I will entertain a motion to".

Councilman Pellitteri said, " Make a motion".
Supervisor Kroyer said, "To authorize the Supervisor to sign the building contract for 2026".
Councilman Giordano said, "So moved, seconded then".
Supervisor Kroyer said, " Ok, ah, Jimmy made it, John seconded it. Ok, ah, all in favor?"
Council Members Giordano, Pellitteri, Scotti and Pumilia all said AYE.
Supervisor Kroyer said, "Any opposed? Hearing none, the motion passes. So, I'll sign that contract tomorrow and mail it back to them".

Security Cameras

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Alright, um, the next is ah, security report, I'm just gonna discuss briefly the, the ah, the security cameras. Um, so, when the union rep contacted myself and the Highway Superintendent back on October 7th, ah, that was my first inkling that they had wanted to discuss this, I responded within the hour, ah I had a discussion with the union representative, Richard Whitney and I agreed with him that prior to the town installing security cameras that I would, that I would contact the union. Now it seems to me like he didn't understand that or maybe there wasn't a quite the meeting of the minds that I thought it was because then we had our meeting, we approved the cameras. Obviously my intentions was to contact Rich again and go over whatever concerns he had but I didn't get a chance to do that cause within two days of our meeting, we received the second letter from the union's attorney. Ok, so when that occurred, that was it, I was done talking to Rich Whitney, the union rep cause now he, he gave it to his attorney to, so I've forwarded it to our attorney for the labor ah negotiations and that is currently being negotiated right now. So, that's where it stands, nobody got out of course, nobody put the cart before the horse on this. That is what happened. Ah, in the letter from the union's attorney they stated that no response ah was received. Well, that's false. As I stated here, I, I responded within an hour of receiving the email and I had probably a ten minute conversation with the union rep and again my agreement with him was prior to installing the cameras we would contact the union. Right, so now it's out of our hands, we're having a, you know it's not out of our hands it will come back to us but it's being negotiated, um on our behalf from ah, from the same attorney that ah, same law firm that handles all union negotiations for the Town of Jewett. Alright, so that's basically where it's at. And we probably will hear back by next month. I haven't heard as of

today, um you know anything that's come of it yet other than the two lawyers are now talking to each other about this. And I'm not sure what any objection would be but whatever, we'll find out I guess".

Councilman Giordano said, "I find it strange they call it surveillance system, when it's a security".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Security yeah they, they, they corrected their language I think John at some point.

Nobody has said that again cause obviously".

Councilman Giordano said, "It says it here in every sentence".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Well, they, that, that".

Councilman Giordano said, "Very good".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "You have the, everybody has it in their folder, you have both communications, the one I received on October 7th".

Councilman Giordano said, "Yup"

Supervisor Kroyer said, "And ah, that one definitely says surveillance cameras, oh yeah, your right and the other one the same thing, so they wanna like, they wanna do something with this for whatever reason, no problem".

Councilman Giordano said, "Just the highway garage? Not this building right?"

Supervisor Kroyer said, "You know, I, I haven't, they haven't said".

Councilman Giordano said, "Just let them, let them hash it out".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Let them tell us. I've, I've asked our attorney that's representing the town to find out what their objection is, if there is any objection".

Councilman Giordano said, "Correct".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "And that, that communication has occurred already. And you know I'm expecting to hear back that there's no objection and we can put the security cameras in for everybody's good. So, let's see what happens, that's basically ah, what I have to say about that. As far as the vote we took last month, that was totally correct, there's nothing wrong with that vote. Alright, it happened to be 4-1 but ah, nobody, nobody got ahead of themselves here. We didn't install the cameras as per my agreement with the union representative. Alright, and we still haven't installed them. So, I'm not sure what anybody's objection is on this. But that's basically the story about all of it, that's where it stands right now.

And, ah, we'll have to update ah, at the next ah meeting. The best I can do. Ok, so that's a done deal".

Fuel Tank Replacement Update

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Next, fuel tank replacement project update, John, you wanna give something on that?"

Councilman Giordano said, "Yes, we've been in touch with Harmon from RM company thru the ah, computerized system and we got them in touch with Main Care, um and there's a note here for everybody I put in ah, this is the notes that we took, the meeting time not been scheduled but the two of them are gonna get together ah so that the pumps are correct for the computer system when Main Care installs the tanks. Um, so they're going to and then of course it says ah Main Cares gave us a quote on October 1st so Mike said he'd like to quickly review and resend a revision, ah because it's now December, can't believe the prices change in 60 days but um that's what's up with the fuel tank right now. Ah system that two companies working together to make this happen and they'll get in touch with us with a date that ah they can, they can meet".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Ok".

Councilman Giordano said, "On site, um so that's our, ah update with the fuel, so and ah and then just if I may, it just jumps out at me, this \$19,000 bill for a, a dump truck ah, I believe a plow truck, um it was never, we spent 19, we have a receipt here to sign for \$20,000 in um, it was never even approached to The Board, no council, um, just no communication that, again don't we have a cap of, I mean we got a bill for \$20,000 grand and we never even knew we had a truck with a problem".

Councilwoman Scotti said, "A truck that was, yeah, out of commission".

Councilman Giordano said, "So, I just don't know, um, do you need all of our signatures on that I guess to pay for that? Um".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "You need at least 3, you know total".

Councilwoman Scotti said, "Well, I didn't sign it".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Ok, Well you know the vouchers are there for you guys".

Councilman Giordano said, "So anyway, just, just".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "To sign or not sign, but I understand and, and, and the reality is we did not know about it until today. I didn't, I was not notified by the Highway Superintendent which is the normal course of how this would occur that there was a truck, you know maybe".

Councilman Giordano said, "It would be nice to".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Maybe he didn't know that it needed so many repairs when it went in, lets, we'll have to wait for the explanation but ah, yeah absolutely a \$20,000 bill um, needs Board approval bottom line. You know, so in the future I'm gonna suggest, then let this be in the minutes that anything over \$1,500 needs to be discussed, at least discussed with the Supervisor, ah prior to ah, committing to that. At least notify us of what's going on, we never were objected to repairs before but we've never had anybody do a \$20,000 repair without notifying us either. So".

Councilman Giordano said, "Right, right getting approval".

Councilwoman Scotti said, "And, and we do need to know if something's wrong with any one of the equipment that we use".

Councilman Giordano said, "Ok, it was my understanding by September 30th every year we were supposed to get a written report of our condition and repairs that needs to be made on our equipment and replacement. So that they can all be funneled into the budget but um we haven't got that report or so anyway, we'll work on it".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Yup, ok, alright um".

Greene EMS Report

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Next item on the agenda, um, Greene EMS, I'm gonna give it today, the report so its um, Greene EMS has sent us a contract which we ah have agreed to like every previous year. And ah, the difference this year is that the County will be picking up the tab. So, it will be no cost to us, we'll still receive the same services from Greene EMS and the County will pay it, ah in addition ah, the Greene, the um, you know the mountain top ambulance services are discussing kind of like a merger where the three of them, Ashland, Windham and Hunter, um, will become like a mountain top ambulance service. Hopefully under the auspices of the County and with County funding, there's supposedly there's a grant their going for, I believe it's 1.2 million or 1.25 million and ah so that's in addition what's been going on with the EMS, um, so".

Councilwoman Scotti said, "We, we have the ah \$38,407 that's gonna help us to pay Windham?"

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Right we get, right we're getting that from the County also".

Councilwoman Scotti said, "We're getting that from the County".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Alright almost 40 grand".

Councilwoman Scotti said, "And we're no longer paying Greene County EMS Paramedics because the County is picking up that as well".

Councilman Pumilia said, "How much does that come out to?"

Councilwoman Scotti said, "Um, about 1840, savings".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Alright, so that's the story with that um, basically so, I think ah that, you know, we're a little better off this year than last year because of this".

Councilwoman Scotti said, "Than last year, yeah".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "But I wouldn't start jumping for joy yet, because".

Councilwoman Scotti said, "No".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "You know there's gonna be the next thing and at some point we're gonna end up paying more, ah, just mark my words on that, ok".

Planning Board

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Ah, planning board liaison. The planning board did not meet, um, they are scheduled to meet prior to our next board meeting. Um, so I, I don't know if they actually gonna meet on the first cause that seems like a holiday but they, maybe they'll reschedule for the second, either way our next meeting is the 14th so I'd like to entertain a motion to re-appoint or slash appoint the following planning board personnel. These appointments will take effect on January 1, 2026.

Reappoint Paul LaPierre as a member to a 5 year term. Re-appoint Barbara Schobel as chair to a 1 year term. Reappoint, I'm sorry, appoint Jonathan Ment as planning board secretary and appoint Renee Blinkwolt as an alternate member who will become a, a, a full member in April upon retirement of Donna Bernard. So, would somebody make that motion?"

Councilman Giordano said, "So moved".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Do I have a second?"

Councilwoman Scotti said, "I'll second it".

Councilman Pumilia said, "We have to vote for?"

Supervisor Kroyer said, "All in favor?"

Council Members Giordano, Pellitteri and Scotti said AYE.

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Any opposed?"

Councilman Pumilia said, "I oppose".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Ok, there it is".

Town Historian Report

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Alright Town Historian Report, everybody has that in they're folder. Ah, she provided that recently, um, you know, I think she's doing an excellent job, Elaine and ah, I thank her for this report".

Councilwoman Scotti said, "Very nice report".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Ok, anybody want to comment on that or".

Councilman Giordano said, "I see we sound, signed a voucher for her right?"

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Yeah, yeah she gets a yearly stipend".

Councilwoman Scotti said, "Stipend".

Councilman Giordano said, "Yup".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "And ah she's done a bunch of stuff and then we have some cemetery signs sitting here that need to be ah put up that she's bought. They've been here for a while. Hopefully we can get those hung up and whatever else she needs, you know".

Councilman Giordano said, "Well the summit of Tower Mountain, John Musacchia, there's a cemetery up there, that's something".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "One of well I say fourteen but I think Elaine has a bigger number than that actually. But the town has these fourteen cemeteries you know. Ah, many of them maintained".

Councilman Pumilia said, "Does that include that little cemetery on Merwin? The little one John on Merwin, right before 23C in the back of the property?"

Councilman Giordano said, "Ah, yes, yup, yup, yup, yeah, yup".

Councilman Pumilia said, "You know what I mean, with the stones maybe? Who's that, I thought that was private, but it doesn't matter".

Councilman Giordano said, "That is um, that is private, yeah, no, I've, that's private. And then there's a private one on ah the farm, the Soulmere Dairy Farm, there's also a private cemetery".

Councilman Pumilia said, "Over here?"

Councilman Giordano said, "Um, over in North Lexington".

Councilman Pumilia said, "Oh".

Councilman Giordano said, "Jewett, County Route 13, just around the corner from the one you're talking about but that they're both private. I didn't realize ah, Tower Mountain".

Councilman Pumilia said, "What, ok Farber's is right here, ok".

Councilman Giordano said, "Yeah that's Matera's cemetery your, you're asking about John".

Councilman Pumilia said, "Ok".

Councilman Giordano said, "Matera's, that's the family that got my father's family up here. Anyway, good job ah Elaine. I have two of these reports, is anybody missing one? The historian report?"

Mountain Eagle News Reporter Mike Ryan said, "I'll take a copy if you've got an extra one".

Councilman Giordano said, "Good, here you go".

Mike Ryan said thank you.

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Alright so, as far as the vouchers, were they all signed?"

Councilman Giordano said, "Yes".

Councilwoman Scotti said, "Yes".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Cause I'm gonna entertain a motion to pay the bills so ah, just curious if there's anything we got to leave out to discuss, I guess not?"

Motion to Pay Bills

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Alright, I will entertain a motion to pay the bills".

Councilman Giordano said, "I'll make a motion to pay the bills".

Councilman Pellitteri said, "Second".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "All in favor?"

Council Members Giordano, Pellitteri, Scotti and Pumilia said AYE.

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Any opposed? Hearing none, the motion passes. We'll send those payments out tomorrow."

General Fund was \$22,785.81 on abstract #12, claim numbers 257-287.

The Highway Fund was \$36,963.91 on abstract #12, claim numbers 195-209.

Supervisors Report

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Um, entertain a motion to accept the financials".

Councilman Pellitteri said, "I make a motion".

Councilman Giordano said, "I'll second the motion".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "All in favor?"

Council Members Giordano, Pellitteri, Scotti and Pumilia said AYE.

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Any opposed? Hearing none the motion passes, the financials are accepted".

Other Business

Councilman Giordano said, "Um, if I may".

Superviosr Kroyer said, "Yeah, you may".

Councilman Giordano said, "May I speak?"

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Absolutely".

Councilman Giordano said, "Um, just something ah, we're sharing, ah the two fire departments Jewett and East Jewett, um, they've came to us at our fireman's dinner. East Jewett was of course is invited with the other towns. And they're gonna come and have a meeting with us in February at our normal February meeting. Um, about, talking about dissolving East Jewett's Fire Department. And having us take over the entire district. So, it's a lot to talk about, ah, it's a big area from one end of town to the other. We would have to take over their fire department as a substation. Our insurance would double".

Councilman Pumilia said, "So, you would keep, you would keep East Jewett as, as a substation".

Councilman Giordano said, "As a substation".

Councilman Pumilia said, "Ok".

Councilman Giordano said, "Um, you know we would have to insure heat, um, we'd have, we'd also have to have some sort of a recruitment, ah big plan to try to get some more young".

Councilwoman Scotti said, "People yeah".

Councilman Giordano said, "Volunteers, which is hard in every district I think, getting harder and harder, but it's something that ah we're discussing between the two fire departments and we're gonna be discussing it here ah in our meeting".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "It's official, official request right?"

Councilman Giordano said, "Yes".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "They want you guys to take over and".

Councilman Giordano said, "Yes".

Councilwoman Scotti said, "John are there any more members from ah East Jewett that are active?"

Councilman Giordano said, "Um, again we're gonna talk about that in February, yeah there's, but their over 70 years old, ah it's um, the last fire they had on Boy Scout Rd. they were toned out twice and ah Haines Falls was to the fire before".

Councilwoman Scotti said, "Right".

Councilman Giordano said, "Before they got there um. So it's just something that's inevitable with our small towns and communities and um, so it's something that we're gonna be discussing and trying to resolve".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "And there's also discussion on changing the whole boundaries of the districts right".

Councilman Giordano said, "Changing the boundaries of possibly Hensonville, Haines Falls and Jewett. We just need to, its gonna take months to kind of figure out. We're gonna get some maps and try to figure out ah this weekend. We're also, we formed a council about dry hydrants and ah I'm on the council with the ah Assistant Chief and we're actually gonna go look at different places to ah put dry hydrants in next to ponds, next to the road so in the winter time we can get um, but it's a big process thru DEP and ah".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Like what's raw in there, what comes out of the pond that they tap into, like that?"

Councilman Giordano said, "With the pipe coming in, right, right. But you need ah permits to do it because it's D, DEP water".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Of course".

Councilman Giordano said, "You know so there's, so we're starting that application process as well and looking for ah, we have one on Hessley Rd. We've got to notify the homeowners and ah, another one on Round Hill Rd. we're looking at and if we're gonna start working into the East Jewett area we're, we wanna try and get a few of these dry hydrants so that its easy to get to water instead of going back to Hensonville and using a fire hydrant which we did during Peck Rd. Farm ah Pelham fire. So different things we're looking at their um so I wanted everybody to be aware".

Councilman Pumilia said, "That will be good, that will be good".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "So just, when you take, so when you go in there, you let them know that we're, our Board is supportive, I'm saying".

Councilman Giordano said, "Yup".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "To anything that continues to give us fire protection".

Councilman Giordano said, "Right".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "We're currently funding both fire companies separately, we're obviously happy to continue doing that, ah you know what I'm saying. The money can come in there, you know".

Councilman Giordano said, "I think we're, maybe one of the two only independent fire departments in the County. That's not owned by the town".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Yeah, it's definitely a different deal that we've got here in the Town of Jewett".

Councilman Giordano said, "We're incorporated and East Jewett and Jewett were independently owned so it's a".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "I mean ah, we knew this was coming, we, I thought it was five to ten years away. Apparently its five minutes away. It's right now you know so".

Councilman Giordano said, "I even said, geez and in ten years we're gonna be 70, who's gonna be, but we got to get a new plan by then".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Right, right you gotta get young people and they got a couple of young members in East Jewett also...".

Councilman Giordano said, "Yup, we just got a couple new members in, I have a list of people to go see again and you know and what got me to re, kind of re-join up, but I've always been a fireman but I've moved out of town and they put that is there a fire within you, you know out on the bulletin board and it made me wheel back in there. But we do have to come up with a good slogan or an idea of ah to recruit, more people".

Councilman Pumilia said, "And what did you call it, what did you call it a dry what?"

Councilman Giordano said, "A dry hydrant".

Councilman Pumilia said, "A dry hydrant, are they expensive?"

Councilman Giordano said, "Ah yeah, they, they they're gonna cost yeah probably you know a couple thousand bucks a piece by the time you get the right strainers and the ah, ah, a AD schedule AD pipe which is 8 inch and then reduces to 6 inch".

Councilman Pumilia said, "All right".

Councilman Giordano said, "We have the plan and then you have to excavate and there's a bunch of".

Councilman Pumilia said, "Alright, I'm asking, alright that be good to know, that would be great if you did that, for us anyway".

Councilman Giordano said, "Yeah, sure, sure would".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Look our Board is gonna be supportive of whatever your fire company can come up with here to keep them in business".

Councilman Giordano said, "Ok, I'll pass that along".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "I mean right you guys, that's how I feel right?"

Councilman Pellitteri said, "Yeah".

Councilwoman Scotti said, "Yeah, of course. John is Hensonville, um are they willing to take on a little bit more district?"

Councilman Giordano said, "Again, we're gonna include them in the meeting in February and ah get everybody on board with this um".

Councilwoman Scotti said, "Because I know they're, you know they're a strong company".

Councilman Giordano said, "Right and they do come this way for East Jewett".

Councilwoman Scotti said, "Absolutely".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "As does Haines Falls and Haines Falls guys work".

Marc Czermerys, IT said, "Haines Falls/ Tannersville now".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Right, right, they're, they're merged right".

Marc Czermerys said, "They merged, yeah well they will be in January 1st".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Right, so, ok".

Councilman Giordano said, "You know, Jewett seems like a retirement town, you know we have no town, like Hunter or Tannersville there's commercial, there's people there working.

There's people involved, where Jewett, we have no, you know, no, no young people, no gas stations, no people".

Councilman Pumilia said, "We have a post office".

Councilman Giordano said, "Yes, but yeah. Yes, yup four hours a day. Anyway, it's hard to find people. So, that's what's going on there and we'll keep everybody posted come the new year".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "That's a big deal, good news. Alright let's ah keep our fingers crossed on that working out somehow. Cause what's the next alternative".

Councilman Giordano said, "Yeah, well you, the town could buy the two fire departments and run it like the rest of the towns, that's an option we haven't talked about. So, I don't know. You know if it's too big or if we have the other neighboring towns don't want to get involved, Hensonville, um, ah I don't know, that wasn't even talked about, you know I hope we don't see this in the newspaper you know this".

Councilman Giordano said, "Because meeting, our first meeting is really in in February. So, this is kind of an in house discussion but its, it's going on".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Let respect our fire companies and see what they can work out".

Councilman Giordano said, "Please".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "And then we'll do our best to support that whatever it is they worked out. That's my summary of it, I think".

Councilwoman Scotti said, "Absolutely".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Ok".

Councilman Giordano said, "So, with that said".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Alright, um, alright. Any public have anything to add tonight? No? Ok. Alright on that note, we'll entertain a motion to adjourn".

Councilman Giordano said, "Um, I'll make a motion to adjourn the meeting I guess".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Second?"

Councilwoman Scotti said, "I'll second".

Supervisor Kroyer said, "All in favor?"

All Councilmembers said AYE.

Supervisor Kroyer said, "Any opposed? Meeting is adjourned".
